This sound library is constantly being updated and improved. Revision disks will be available to keep your library up-to-date.

Please note the following conventions:

LL - LOW LOW (bottom of keyboard)
L - LOW
M - MEDIUM (middle of keyboard)
H - HIGH
HH - HIGH HIGH (top of keyboard)
Z - RE-SYNTHESISED SOUND
FALL - SWITCH ACTIVATED PORTAMENTO

Sound names that end with the above letters (L,M,H) indicate the approximate "useful" range of the sound.

A "Z" suffix denotes a sound that has been analyzed and computed resulting in the re-synthesis of the original sound.

A "FALL" suffix denotes a control, usually SWITCH2, patched to activate a downwards portamento.

Filename "PAGERBED.IN" is a "skeleton" file that when loaded will allow instrument files to be easily created on Page 3 for use on Page R.

The sound effects ranges have not been stipulated, as the authenticity of the sound is only preserved at the sampled note (which can easily be established through experimentation).

Most of the sounds presently forming the library were sampled in our Sydney studio, although occasionally we receive sounds from users that are of sufficiently high quality to warrant inclusion.

Should you have a sound, or sounds, that you feel might meet this high standard, we welcome your submissions, with the prospect of any sound included being given full credit in this most prestigious collection.
